

[Hereafter as BoD (RCL)] comprises 11-15 members and run different educational institutions under their jurisdiction. Academic Committee is the main authority to make operational policy and regulations, recruit required employees, purchase needful for different academic institutions within their jurisdiction. Academic Committee deserves the right of the financial authority for implementation and management purpose within the given annual budget from the BoD (RCL). This committee comprises two subcommittees namely Selection Committee and Performance Evaluation Committee. Formation of these committees will be done by the Academic Committee.

BoD (RCL): BoD (RCL) forms through the mandate of the General Members of the Rising Chittagong Limited (RCL) as per the rules and regulations of the RCL constitution. Tenure of BoD (RCL) is three consecutive years. The BoD (RCL) holds the supreme authority to make policies and strategies to establish, govern and run different institutions and will allocate budget and resources wherever it requires.

❖ Teachers Learning Centre:

We have created a Teacher Learning Community where we share our views, experience and teaching techniques once a month. We have divided all the teachers of three schools in 11 groups. The aim of this programme is to create a congenial working environment among the colleagues as well as to ensure a same standard of teaching and learning approach in the whole school.

There will be nine TLC workshops initially and the learning intentions are as follows:

- Share successes and failures, and support each other
- Establish effective ways of working collaboratively
- Understand how to incorporate learning intention into lessons and why this is important
- Improve classroom questioning and discussion
- Involve all students in lessons
- Mark less whilst giving students more responsibility
- Keep records of students' progress that help teaching and learning
- Activate students as instructional resources for one another
- Use hinge-point questions to find out what students know at some point in a lesson
- Make some formative use of summative tests
- Activate students as owners of their own learning
- Review our work together as a TLC group this year and how it has helped student learning.

❖ Advanced Learning Centre:

Presidency International School (PIS) in Chittagong, Bangladesh, offers an Advanced Learning Centre (ALC) that provides specialized support to students aiming for higher academic achievements. The ALC focuses on:





